


- **EECF Timeline and LaaR Response Summary**

- ERCOT Declares EECF Step 1 @ 15:25
- ERCOT Declares EECF Step 2 @ 15:34 - Hot Line Call to all QSE's to Deploy All LaaRs
- First LaaRs respond at 15:38
- 10 Minutes after Instruction Issued about 548 MW of LaaR Response
- LaaR Response reaches 95% of obligation at 15:52
- At around 16:00 ERCOT loses about 1200 MW of Generation thru 4 units
- ERCOT Declares EECF Step 4 @ 16:13 and Initiates Firm Load Shed
- Firm Load Recalled at 17:31 and completed by 16:10
- 50% of LaaRs recalled at 18:21 and balance at 18:29
- LaaRs recover to 95% of obligation capacity at 21:25


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- **Initial Investigation Looking Primarily at QSE Portfolios**
- **9 QSE's Active in the Market on 4/17**
- **Initial Portfolio Response sent to QSE's**
- **Questions sent to any QSE that did not appear to comply with the ERCOT Operator's Instructions**
 - Did your response meet your obligation?
 - Did you respond within the 10 minute requirement?
 - Did you maintain your response during the entire deployment period?
 - Did you get back to your committed level within 3 hours of the recall notice?
 - Did any individual LaaR come back on line during the deployment period?
 - What Corrective Action have you taken since the event
- **Responses received from all QSE's—additional analysis still on-going**
