


ERCOT Market Information System Site Map

Note: This diagram does not represent the final "look and feel" of the MIS. Its purpose is to represent information only.



These are customizable "portlets", configured by the user. They represent lists of selected reports, extracts, notices or applications.

Only entities with access to secure or certified information may access the MIS. The MIS, however, will contain links to all information – public, secure and certified – specified in the protocols. Upon successful authentication, MIS will display "My MIS" as the home page.



Clicking the tab Reports and Extracts takes you to the landing page for Reports and Extracts. It may be possible to populate the content area with your most frequently used reports.

The left navigation menu is structured to follow the protocol sections. This expandable menu allows you to view all reports your role allows you to access. In this example, we click on Section 6, which expands the section. (See Figure 3)




Clicking a subsection under Section 6 refreshes the content area with all reports and extracts in the selected subsection that your role can view. This includes public, secure and certified information.

Next to each report and extract is a select box, which lets you choose to display the report link on My Reports page or on My MIS page. (Note: Actual implementation of customizing My MIS page may vary from this prototype.)

Clicking the name of the report takes you to the report itself (See Figure 4)




In this example, this report is available in multiple formats. It displays links to the most recent reports. Older reports may be accessed by clicking "archives".




These are customizable "portlets", configured by the user. They represent lists of selected reports, extracts, notices or applications.

Although not specified in the protocols, we recommend providing access to ERCOT applications through the MIS. Simple applications like query screens may be presented in the content area (See Figure 5), while complex applications will launch in a new browser window (See Figure 6).


Only those applications accessible to a given role will appear in the navigation men




Complex applications are launched in a new browser window.




Because the nature of notices is different from reports and extracts, they have their own tab.
