Brief Description of the Event(s):

June 18 02:09 — Multiple Wind farms in West Texas tripped off line following severe thunderstorms in the area. Seven wind farms tripped 403 MW within one minute; another two took 137 MW off line within the following two minutes, causing the total loss of 540 MWs. This amount of generation loss caused the frequency to drop to 59.862 Hz. ERCOT ISO deployed 563 MW of Responsive Reserve Service to stabilize the system.

June 18 16:37 — An Emergency Electrical Curtailment Plan (EECP) Step 1 was issued by ERCOT ISO due to the Adjusted Responsive Reserves falling below 2300 MW. Load forecasting errors in both the Day-Ahead and current day operations may have been contributing factors to this event.

June 27 14:50 — A forced unit outage in the South West Texas area, occurred following unit voltage regulator transformer failure. This loss of generation led ERCOT ISO to request emergency power from Comision Federal de Electricidad (CFE) through the south DC ties to help support the affected area.

June 30 23:45 – ERCOT ISO issued an Emergency Notice due to the failure of the Day-Ahead Market RPRS to complete prior to the deadline at 18:00. ERCOT ISO did manage to use other resources to complete its task and cancelled the notice at 23:45.
