Declarations of Weather Preparedness (DoWP) Submission Period for Winter 2025-2026:

November 1, 2025-December 1, 2025


Last day to submit a declaration: Monday, December 1, 2025



General Guidelines for Submitting a Declaration of Weather Preparedness (DoWP)



Step 1: Gain access to the portal

To complete actions within the Weatherization & Inspection Market Participant Portal (portal), an MP User Security Administrator (USA) must provision an MP representative with a digital certificate with the manager role, SN_M_W_MGR_ECEII.

Step 2: Enter the portal and navigate to 'Submissions & Requests'

 Navigate to the Category 'DoWP – RE – Winter' or 'DoWP – TSP – Winter'


Step 3: Complete Appendix A

Step 4: Complete the Notarized Attestation

- Upload the Notarized Attestation
- Optional: attach supplemental documents

Reminders for Completing the TSP Appendix A

- A TSP <u>must</u> identify a responsible ERCOT Market Participant for any substation/switchyard that is listed on the Appendix A and identified as not covered under the declaration due to:
 - TSP does not own or operate equipment at this substation, or
 - Another entity performs the required weatherization activities for this substation
- Required: The responsible ERCOT Market Participant must be identified in the 'Comments' field.
- The responsible ERCOT Market Participant identified in the 'Comments' field must also submit an Appendix A and declare the substation/switchyard to affirm its status as the owner, operator, or weatherization entity.
- If the two entities' selections do not align, ERCOT will default to the owner in ERCOT records.

NEW: The Weatherization Inspection Process Guidance Document

The Weatherization Inspection Process guidance document is a new resource on the Summer and Winter Weather Readiness webpages that highlights what to expect before, during, and after a weatherization inspection.

• The document includes key highlights and a detailed outline of what to expect before, during, and after an inspection.

Notification & Preparation

- At least 72 hours prior: ERCOT issues a Notice of Inspection (NOI).
- Within 24 hours: The RE/TSP must acknowledge the NOI.
- Prior to inspection: RE/TSP share documents via the Weatherization & Inspection Market Participant portal.
- Inspector reviews documents and confirms site logistics.

On-Site Inspection

- Arrival: Inspector checks in and holds an initial meeting.
- Execution: Inspector conducts a documentation review and a physical site walkthrough, comparing records to field conditions.
- Exit: Inspector provides a summary of findings before leaving the site.

Reporting & Follow-Up

- Within 2 weeks (typically): RE/TSP receives the final inspection report via the inspection work order on the portal.
- If applicable: An RE/TSP with an unresolved compliance deficiency is provided with a cure period. The RE/TSP reports progress to ERCOT semi-monthly and ERCOT tracks to resolution.



NEW: ERCOT Weatherization and Inspection Information Session for Resource Entities

This information session provides Resource Entities (REs) with an overview of the ERCOT Weatherization and Inspection (W&I) program. Topics include—

- Compliance requirements under the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) Weather Emergency Preparedness Rule, 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §25.55 (rule).
- Use of the W&I Market Participant Portal.
- The process for submitting a Declaration of Weather Preparedness.
- Best practices for preparing for a weatherization inspection.
- What to expect before, during, and after an inspection.
- How ERCOT addresses compliance deficiencies.


